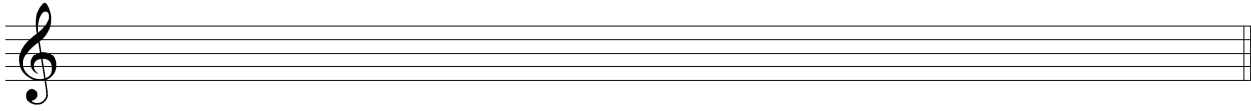


1. Write an A major scale using accidentals (no key signature). Label the whole and half steps.

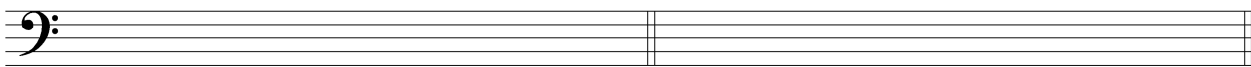
